'Smartness' here means preparedness and the ability to respond to a situation PTI Updated: Apr 08, 2017, 08.07 AM IST New Delhi/Bengaluru: The central government's 21st Pay Commission has recommended more financial aid for dependents of the Armed Forces as also the lowest division of services. Employees in the Army, Air Force, Navy and the Coast Guard, who have dependent family members, will get an additional Rs 5,000 per month while those in the lowest service will get a hike of Rs 2,500 per month. The pay revision — which goes into effect from January 1, 2017 — has been done keeping in mind the recommendations made by the Seventh Pay Commission, which was formed in 2007 and continued till its last pay panel, 16th Pay Commission. Carrying forward the Seventh Pay Commission, 21st Pay Commission has set the maximum age of a Central Government employee and pensioners to 60 years and also suggested that they should get 100 per cent of the minimum salary on retirement, officials said. So far, the retirement age was not earlier than 60 years. The Commission suggested that the pensioner should be given a 50 per centum of the minimum salary on attaining the superannuation age. The Cabinet is expected to give its nod to the recommendations of the Commission sometime next month, they said. Talking to reporters here, Chairman of the Commission U K Sinha said the present income ceiling for pension will not be applicable from January 1, 2017 and the pensioner's annual income will have to be calculated according to his family's annual income and family size. Sinha said the maximum limit for the pensioner is 66 years of age and pension for a family, with maximum of four members will not exceed Rs 2.50 lakh per annum. He said the commission was constituted keeping in mind the crucial requirement of the armed forces. The Commission has proposed the merger of 13 central armed police forces, and formation of three new armed forces in the North-East region to plug the gap in the police forces and ensure better deployment of forces. Sinha said the Commission has also sought introduction of a single database for all central government employees for their statutory services, implementation of Common Service
